CAMPGROUNDS

A. BOGACHIEL STATE PARK: 36 campsites on the Bogachiel River. Tables, grates, river fishing, cooking shelter, showers, rest room, dump station, 6 hookups, RVs to 35'. (360) 374-6353.

B. (Listing has been removed until further notice.)

C. MINNIE PETERSON: 8 sites adjacent to the Peterson Ranch. Upper Hoh Road, RVs, fishing. Vault toilets and no water. DNR

D. HARD RAIN CAFÉ & MERCANTILE: 7 sites with full hookups, 6 sites with electricity, tenting, rest room, showers, seasonal café and store also on site, see business listing for more information.

E. SOUTH FORK HOH: 7 sites, primitive, 2 miles from Olympic National Park. Driving distance to trailhead, trail maintained for first 3 miles. Vault toilets and no water. DNR

F. HOH CAMPGROUND: 88 sites along the bank of the Hoh River, grates, tables, flush toilets, campfire program, hiking, fishing, no hookups, open all year. Olympic National Park - see Hoh Rain Forest under Points of Interest for more details.

G. HOH-OXBOW: 8 sites forested on bluff overlooking river, some RV, primitive, launch for small boats. Vault toilets and no water. DNR

J. KALALOCH: 166 sites (three accessible), fire pits with grates, picnic tables, potable water, accessible restrooms, animal-proof food storage, RV dump station (fee). Reservations in summer only; see recreation.gov or (877) 444-6777

K. SOUTH BEACH (Open summer only): 50 sites, picnic tables and fire pits, dirt road, flush toilets, BUT NO WATER (water available at Kalaloch campground dump station). Olympic National Park

L. LION'S CLUB: Cooking shelter, covered picnic tables, pit toilets, day use, no fee.

M. COPPERMINE BOTTOM: 10 sites, covered picnic area, RVs, fern and alder bottom, boat launch. Vault toilets and no water. DNR

N. UPPER CLEARWATER: 6 sites, covered picnic area, RVs allowed but not recommended (not a loop campground) Vault toilets and no water. DNR

O. YAHOO LAKE: 3 sites, 400-foot trail from road, no RVs, primitive. Vault toilets and no water. DNR

P. QUEETS CAMPGROUND: About 20 sites, open year-round, pit toilets, no potable water, no hookups. Trailers not advised. Olympic National Park

Q. COTTONWOOD: 10 sites, hiking, fishing, hand boat launch. Vault toilets and no water. DNR
